I Love Sunday School

The reason I am a Christian and pastor today is because of Sunday school. There was a thriving one in my home church. My teacher, Mrs. Lib, not only taught me about God's love but was God's love to me. She instilled in me not only a knowledge of the scriptures but also a love for them that has grown until this day. All that I have become and am becoming goes back to Sunday school. I imagine that if I could ask each of you now if Sunday school had meant as much to you and your family, most of you would say yes.

For some time now, our Sunday school program here has been hurting. There are various reasons for it. But the main one is that it has not had its own hour or time slot in our Sunday morning schedule. For example, most churches, even ones larger than our own, have two services, with a Sunday school hour in-between. They have found that this really appeals to young families as they are looking for both an educational and worship experience on Sunday morning (which is what most of us grew up having). In fact, Sudley also had such a schedule some years ago and the Sunday school program thrived then. Our church council recently decided to go back to that pattern that worked so well. So our new schedule, starting July 6th, will be as follows:

9:00am Contemporary worship
11:00am Traditional worship
(combining the 8am & 11am services)
Sunday school in-between



Our Sunday school now will not just be primarily for children. While their children are in classes, parents and other adults will also have choices from a variety of short-term classes of need and interest to them. You will be getting more information about these classes soon and how to sign up for them. For example, I will be leading a class for couples. My wife, Debbie, would like to lead one on how to make baskets. We have others who will be offering classes. *Is there a class or topic that you could lead or would like to see offered? Let me know.* This promises to be an exciting

experience as we get the best from both small group nurture and worship. It's an idea whose time has come (again).


Everyone is being offered an opportunity for significant growth, fellowship, and continued meaningful worship. I hope that you will take full advantage of this. If you have never or for a long time not

Pastor's Bible Study




Come kick-off our new fellowship group "The Sudlies." We will have a monthly potluck and other planned outings (hiking, wineries, baseball games and more. . .)



Haiti Missions - How Your Contributions are used to create HOPE

The overriding purpose of the mission trips to Haiti is to create HOPE. The purpose is accomplished through the provision of clean water, food, basic human and health needs, housing, and establishing relationships. In the 10 years of Sudley's presence in Haiti, several other organizations have formed as offshoots of Empowering Haitians. Substantial funding, in private donations from individuals, have been received because the work accomplished by Empowering Haitians has inspired others to believe in the mission work being done in Haiti. Enabled by Sudley's consistent presence in Haiti, churches and district conferences throughout Virginia have contributed more than \$125,000 to feeding programs, Vacation Bible School and construction projects. Churches and other organizations are able to plan on either a winter or summer trip because they know that Sudley and Empowering Haitians will be there to facilitate their travel arrangements and provide local workers and interpreters to support the various mission work. Empowering Haitians also focuses on helping reduce the difficulty for individual missionaries to go to Haiti. The missionaries travel to Haiti at their own expense, which typically is \$1600.00. Every dollar that is donated by Sudley UMC is spent in Haiti to provide goods and services to Haitians. 100% of all money donated to Empowering Haitians is used to support mission work in Haiti. Empowering Haitians keeps detailed expense reports about how money is spent in Haiti to ensure that every dollar is accounted for and spent properly.

I have been informed that Sudley will contribute approximately \$3,000.00 for the July mission trip. Examples of how the money will be used are:

- Build a house
- Purchase shoes for approximately 100 children
- Assist in Vacation Bible School
- Purchase a goat
- Provide noon meals (beans & rice) for Haitian workers who are assisting us
- Provide meals over a longer term for the more needy in the community
- Identify and establish new sources of clean water
- Identify and arrange medical care for a seriously ill individual. We will arrange for services to be provided in either Haiti or the United States.

Records are kept to verify the amounts and purposes of the expenditures. Examples of the costs are:

Meals per day for workers	\$30
Daily Peanut Butter Mission (Week)	\$75

Shoes-flip flops (for 100 Children)	\$300
Vacation Bible School Supplies per week	\$550
Cost to operate school bus one week	\$200
Workers per week (e.g., boss mason/laborers)	\$100/ \$50
Misc. labor per trip (electrical, masonry, plumbing)	\$500
Misc. materials per trip for orphanages and clinics	\$500
Establishing Relationships (Free)	\$0.00
Creating Hope (Free)	\$0.00

Building a house, obtaining a goat, arranging for medical care, and sources for clean water provide long term benefits that continue long after the missionaries leave.

At their own expense, missionaries purchase tools for construction projects, soccer balls, toys for children, and other items not available in the local markets and shops and transport or ship them to Haiti. If items can be found in Haiti, missionaries typically purchase them there as we want to spend all the money in Haiti where it will do the most good. Social services and supporting organizations do not exist in Haiti. There are no food banks in Cap Haitian, nor are there organizations that function like SERVE. Even the Churches are not able to do much more than just pay the rent on their land. Sudley and Empowering Haitians provide a hand to the poorest of the poor, a meal to the hungry and love to the lonely. While the need is far greater than what one small church can do, we can, and have done something. We have made a difference! Also, the missionaries are truly blessed with the experiences.

The funds that Sudley has invested in Haiti have been multiplied many times over in real dollars that have been donated by other organizations and by the services provided by individuals attracted to Haiti by Sudley's presence. Sudley planted seeds 10 years ago that are yielding ongoing and bountiful harvests.

Campus Outreach Ministries

As many of you are aware, our own Alex Latham, has decided to spend her first one to three post-graduate years working in the mission field through Campus Outreach at Virginia Tech. This ministry was truly transformational for Alex during her years as a student at Virginia Tech, and she feels called to help other students grow as disciples of Christ while navigating their tricky college years. The vision of Campus Outreach is "Glorifying God by Building



Laborers on the Campus for the Lost World." They seek to build laborers with a commitment to Jesus and His Great Commission through evangelism and discipleship. They are passionately reaching students with the gospel and training them to become mature followers of Christ. Their end desire is to see students leave college equipped to labor in the harvest field for the glory of God.

Like most people in the mission field, Alex is required to raise her own annual financial support, so that she can focus 100% of her energy and attention to ministry during the school year. Campus Outreach estimates that each Virginia Tech

missioner needs approximately \$24,000 per year to cover their living expenses such as rent, utilities and food. Alex has already been very busy raising this support since she graduated from Tech in May, and the mission committee of Sudley Church believes that a modest monthly sponsorship of \$100 per month is an appropriate use of our mission tithe. However, in order to encourage others from Alex's home church to invest in her ministry, we are also offering a matching gift for every sponsorship that Alex receives through our church, up to \$150 per month, for a total contribution of \$250 per month from the mission tithe. While single donations are helpful, what she really needs are partners who are willing to come along side her and invest in this life-changing ministry on a monthly basis. So, your \$25 or \$50 monthly donation could become \$50 or \$100 monthly - and will make a meaningful dent in her annual requirement.



Sudley’s Stories



My death, November 9, 1977, at 1:30am

For those of you who missed Les’ testimony on Father’s Day, it is below:

Les got up to speak and started by giving the date that his death took place. He said that he was playing basketball with his friend Bob Herrity when his arm went numb and he just didn't feel right. Bob told him to sit down for awhile. After awhile he went to play again but felt worse and he had trouble moving his legs. Bob’s daughter worked in the emergency room of Fairfax Hospital and Bob called her and told her what was happening and she said to come immediately to the hospital. Then he went into the following.

“I remember coming forward in my bed, I fought it for a few minutes (Death), I knew something was happening, I said to myself, “What's the use”, then I was going through something like a tunnel but it wasn't a tunnel, it was very quiet and very peaceful with no pain. It was kind of foggy but it wasn't. On the right it was very dark, It was a very dark valley, I couldn't see to the end. Then a beautiful light shown upon me and I felt like I was wrapped in God’s arms. Nothing on this earth like it. I could hear birds and beautiful music. I could see from my shoulders from there down. I was dressed in a pure white robe, the most beautiful robe I have ever seen. I saw Bob Herrity and Nancy Willoughby appear. Bob said, he loved me and he didn't want me to die. Nancy said, “Me too”. I then woke up and all the nurses and doctors were around me. I was very angry because I didn't want to come back. But God had other plans for me. The Nancy I referred to earlier is now my wife.”


