# FOLLOWING JESUS THROUGH THE HOLY LAND

What an amazing experience I was privileged to have! As John Wesley said, "*I felt my heart strangely warmed*," as we traveled through the Holy Land, walking the dry and dusty land where two thousand years ago Christ walked. We saw the town of Nazareth where Jesus grew up, where Mary heard the news that she would bear the Christ child and call Him Jesus.



Continuing on our way we visited the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist and where members of our group were baptized.



We visited towns in the region of Galilee where Jesus carried out His Ministry – feeding the multitudes, teaching in Capernaum, delivering the Sermon on the Mount.



A boat ride across the Sea of Galilee was truly a heart-warming experience as we sang and danced with the boat bouncing across the waters. Visiting the Jesus Boat brought the lives of the Disciples into focus as I saw them pulling in nets of fish, then becoming fishers of men.

Entering Jerusalem almost made my heart stop as we sang The Holy City, the white buildings glowing in the sunset. At the same time we were nearing the end of our trip and the end of Our Savior's life on earth.

We visited the house of Caiaphas, the High Priest who presided over Jesus's trail, and saw the cell in which Jesus was held, where he was scourged and bound. We followed the Via Dolorosa, the Way of Sorrow, where Jesus was condemned to death by Pontius Pilate and where He was forced to carry His cross. The Via Dolorosa ends in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, a church consecrated in 335 AD. Believed to be the site of the crucifixon, the rock which stood in front of the cross and the stone slab upon which Jesus's body lay after His death are in the church. Lastly we visited the Garden Tomb at the end of a blessed trip.


#### TRUSTEES
